

Zanzibar Gathering: Responsibility & Safety Guidelines

SANDBANK & SECRET ISLAND

Stay Hydrated

Make sure to drink enough water throughout the day. Water will be available at the bar on the island and sandbank, but bring your own extra water for the journey there and back.

Eat Beforehand and Bring Snacks

The trip to the islands takes a few hours, so have breakfast or pack snacks. Food will be served on the island.

Watch Your Step

There are many sea urchins in the water, so be careful where you walk or swim. It is highly recommended to wear flip-flops or reef shoes when boarding the boats and walking in shallow waters. Sharp coral and sea urchins can cause injuries, so proper footwear is important for your safety.

Safe Swimming

Do not swim more than 20 meters from the island and only swim in designated areas, as the current can be very strong and dangerous.

Listen to the Boat Captains

The boat captains are responsible for your safety and well-being, so please follow their instructions at all times.

Protect Nature

Respect the environment by avoiding coral and not disturbing marine life. Use the trash bags or bins on site, or take your litter with you. Do not pick up or handle starfish, as they are extremely fragile and can be harmed easily.

Group Boarding

Wait until your entire group is present before boarding the boat. If someone from your group is missing, inform the event staff immediately.

Awareness & Drug Policy

Look out for one another, and if you see

someone who needs assistance, tell the team. Arriving overly intoxicated or using illegal substances endangers yourself and others, and we reserve the right to refuse entry or remove anyone jeopardizing safety or well-being.

Respect Everyone Around You

Keep an eye on fellow attendees to help create a fun and supportive environment, and be mindful of personal space and consent.

Medical Assistance

A doctor will be present on the island in case you step on a sea urchin or require any medical assistance.

Sun Protection

Wear sunscreen to protect yourself and bring a cap or hat to shield your face from the sun. There is plenty of shade on the secret island, while shade on the sandbank is more limited.

Safety

Keep valuables secure, as the organizers are not responsible for lost items.

WHY?NOT CLUB

Keep Cups and Glasses Inside

Do not take club glasses or cups outside the venue.

Neighborhood Awareness

Be mindful of noise levels outside the club, as there are hotels and local accommodations nearby. Respect the community and avoid unnecessary disturbances.

Look Out for Each Other

If you see someone feeling unwell or in need of assistance, inform staff or security immediately.

Keep your valuables secure, as the organizers are not responsible for lost items.
